FOR YOUR COLLECTION OF FALL BLOOMERS, BURMESE PLUMBAGO, (AKA GRIFFITH'S LEADWORT) PROVIDES A FOILTOTHE MANY GOLDS AND REDS OF AUTUMN, ITS VIBRANT SKY BLUE BLOSSOMS SURROUNDED BY BRICK RED BRACTS THE PERFECT COMPLIMENT. TALLER THAN THE MORE OFTEN SEEN CAPE PLUMBAGO, WHICH GROWS AS A GROUNDCOVER, IT HAS WIRY, MOUNDING STEMS THAT REACH 3 HIGH AND AS WIDE AS GACROSS. THE SMALL, LEATHERY LEAVES ARE SEMI-EVERGREEN, BUTTAKE ON A DEEP RED HUE AS COOLER. TEMPERATURES ARRIVE, OFTEN WHILE THE PLANT IS STILL BLOOMING! DROUGHTTOLERANT, AND FROST HARDY TO ZONE 7A, BURMESE PLUMBAGO IS NOT ON THE DEER'S PREFERRED EATING LIST AND GROWS HAPPILY IN THOSE DIFFICULT, DRY, PARTIALLY SHADED CONDITIONS WHERE FEW PLANTS THRIVE.
