A GARDEN CLASSIC! TALL AND STATELY, PURPLE CONEFLOWER IS ATTRACTIVE TO MYRIAD POLLINATORS ONCE IT STARTS BLOOMING IN MIDSUMMER, AND IS ESPECIALLY ATTRACTIVE TO BUTTERFLIES FOR WHICH THE SPIKY ORANGE CONES PROVIDES A STURDY LANDING PAD. REBLOOMS UNTIL FROST. REMOVE SPENT SEED HEADS TO KEEP THE BLOSSOMS COMING, BUT DON'T FORGET TO LEAVE PLENTY STANDING JUST BEFORE THE PLANT GOES DORMANT FOR THE WINTER. BIRDS WILL VISIT THEM THROUGH THE WINTER TO ENJOY THE SEEDS. MAKES A GREAT CUT FLOWER! DROUGHT-TOLERANT, CLAY-TOLERANT AND GENERALLY LEFT ALONE BY DEER
