

# WOODLAND STRAWBERRY

## FRAGARIA CALIFORNICA

AKA: FRAGARIA VESCA

WOODLAND STRAWBERRY IS A SWEET, BOTH IN LOOKS AND IN FLAVOR, LITTLE NATIVE GROUNDCOVER SPREADING BY STOLONS, OR RUNNERS, AS THEY ARE MORE COMMONLY KNOWN, IT WILL FILL A LARGE AMOUNT OF SPACE IN A SHORT-TIME. LIKING A BIT OF SHADE IN OUR HOT INTERIOR CLIMATE, IT IS A NICE PLANT FOR UNDER NATIVE OAKS AND CONIFERS. BECOMES DROUGHT-TOLERANT WITH AGE, BUT PRODUCES MORE OF THE DELICIOUS SMALL FRUIT IF WATERED. HAPPILY GROWS IN SUNNIER SPOTS IF WATER IS READILY AVAILABLE. THE PLANT, LEAVES, AND FRUIT ARE ALL SMALLER THAN CULTIVATED STRAWBERRIES, BUT THE FRUIT PACKS A FLAVORFUL PUNCH. A GREAT PLANT FOR CHILDREN WHO LOVE TO HUNT FOR THE TINY FRUITS.
