

WHITE GROSSO LAVENDER

LAVANDULA X INTERMEDIA 'ALBA'



THOUGH IT MAY SEEM COUNTERINTUITIVE, THERE IS INDEED A WHITE LAVENDER WHITE GROSSO IS A HIGHLY FRAGRANT, WHITE BLOOMING FORM OF THE FAMILIAR LAVENDIN WE ALL KNOW AND LOVE. EQUALLY DROUGHT AND DEERTOLERANT AS ITS COUSIN, GROSSO, THIS WHITE BLOOMING FORM ADDS A BIT OF SPARKLE AND CONTRAST TO THE HERB AND CUTTING GARDEN. THE POLLINATOR ATTRACTING, EDIBLE BLOSSOMS APPEAR AT THE SAME TIME AS OTHER LAVENDERS, IN EARLY TO MID SUMMER, AND WILL FLUSH AGAIN IF THE SPENT FLOWERS (OR FRESH!) ARE REMOVED. LAVENDER WILL READILY GROW IN POOR SOIL, BUT BE SURE TO PROVIDE GOOD DRAINAGE. UNLIKE MANY OTHER PLANTS, LAVENDER PREFERS NOT TO HAVE ORGANIC MULCH AROUND ITS CROWN. INSTEAD, MULCH THE AREA IMMEDIATELY AROUND THE PLANT WITH GRAVEL. CUT THE 3 1/2' PLANTS BACK OFTEN TO PRESERVE YOUTHFULNESS, AND ENJOY!
