

INDIGO WOODLAND SAGE

SALVIA FORSKAOLEI

THIS HARDY SAGE HAS THE FAIRLY UNUSUAL HABIT OF FORMING A BASAL CLUMP OF LARGE LEAVES FROM WHICH EMERGE THE TALL STALKS OF VIOLET FLOWERS ARRANGED IN WHORLS AROUND THE STEM. A LOVELY GARDEN PLANT, IT IS ATTRACTIVE TO BEES AND BUTTERFLIES AND TOLERATES DROUGHT. GROWS GLADLY IN PARTIAL SHADE, WHERE IT LOOKS PARTICULARLY NICE EN MASSE. A VIGOROUS GROWER, IT SEEDS ITSELF READILY, RESULTING IN MORE LOVELY PLANTS TO GRACE YOUR GARDEN. THE WHITE-MARKED VIOLET BLOOMS ELEVATE THE OTHERWISE LOW PLANT TO 36" IN HEIGHT. A TRULY BEAUTIFUL PLANT FOR THE WOODLAND GARDEN!
