

AUTUMN STONECROP

SEDUM 'FROSTY MORN'



AN ICY COOL ADDITION TO THE ROCK GARDEN OR ANY AREA WITH DECENT DRAINAGE, THIS UPRIGHT SEDUM HAS LVELY, VARIEGATED LEAVES WHICH SEEM TO LIGHT UP THE ROOM. THE LATE SEASON FLOWERS ARE WHITE TO ICE PINK, DEPENDING ON THE TEMPERATURE. LIKE OTHER UPRIGHT STONECROPS, THE FLAT-TOPPED BLOOMS OF THIS ONE ARE MUCH-LOVED BY BUTTERFLIES. A CLUMP FORMER, FROSTY MORN WILL REACH 12" HIGH AND WIDE. ONCE THE UPRIGHT STEMS DIE BACK FOR WINTER, CUT THEM BACK TO THE SMALL, CABBAGE-LIKE ROSETTES FORMING AT THE BASE OF THE PLANT TO MAKE WAY FOR NEXT SEASON'S GROWTH. IF THE PLANT STARTS TO PRODUCE SOME STEMS THAT ARE ALL GREEN, SIMPLY REMOVE THE GREEN STEMS AS THEY APPEAR TO PRESERVE THE LOVELY VARIEGATION.
